

# Camping

**Outdoor Overnight Camping** 

Cantigny Park has three campsites available for rental to Scout and youth groups. Our campsites are limited to nationally recognized youth groups (i.e., BSA, GSA, AWANA, YMCA Adventure Guides, etc.).

Each site holds up to 50 people (tent camping only, trailers and campers are prohibited). Only one campsite per group is allowed. Overnight camping is year round, except during January when the park is closed, and is only allowed on Friday and Saturday nights.

Campgrounds and Education Center offer fire pits, firewood, picnic tables, trash collection, campground restrooms, showers, potable water and recycling bins.
